Family Bible Time

"You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down and when you rise" (Deut. 6:, 7).

Family Bible Time is our new program we intend to begin tonight at 5:00, for about 10-12 minutes, before we enter into the formal worship hour. It is an idea we have adapted from a similar program developed and run by Glenn Colley of the West Huntsville church. Our goal is make an effort to show our kids that they are important to us, and that we care about their learning and growth, all in the presence, and with the participation, of the entire church family.

Here is some information on how it works:

- At, or a few minutes before, 5:00 PM, try to have all your children down in the front few rows of pews. This is where we will meet EVERY Sunday evening. We will start the time with singing the "B-I-B-L-E."
- It is a program emphasizing <u>rote memorization</u> of Bible facts, and where they are found in the Scripture. The information is learned in a fun setting, through working together memorizing our "Bible Time" cards.
- Each child will receive a ring of 12 "Bible Time" cards, each with a different theme (i.e. Book of Genesis, General Bible Info, Book of John, etc.). Cards will be ready soon.
- It is *Family Bible Time* because we work on the cards together as a *church* family. But more importantly, we hope that the cards will be something each individual *Family* will do together with their children at home. With parents' help, they can memorize the whole card! (Note: Adults are more than welcome to memorize cards as an example and encouragement to the kids, or to try to keep up with them. haha.)
- When the child feels like he/she has a grasp of an entire card, they are to find an elder, recite the card from memory, and if successful, will receive a reward! Each child will receive a medal, and a special pin to hang on his/her own banner in the foyer for the whole church to see the progress that has been made.
- We will end with the singing of a song, at which point the regular service will begin immediately, while the kids are returning to their seats.

IMPORTANT: We **WANT** and **HOPE FOR** your help and support during these 12 minutes. This is not meant to give more time for socializing in the foyer, or to make us think that services now begin at 5:15. When we recite the books of the Bible together, we want you **ALL** sitting with us in the auditorium, helping the kids say them. Or when little Billy is invited to the front to receive his medal and pin, we want you **ALL** to be there to see it and show him how proud you are of him. This is *Family Bible Time*. Let us, together, show the kids that <u>their</u> learning time is just as important as <u>our</u> learning time.



"BUT SUCH AS IS COMMON TO MAN"

Those of you who are regular bible students will recognize the title of this article as coming from 1st Corinthians 10:13 and was used by the Apostle Paul to introduce the subject of temptations which are common to man. Consider the following where the word "common" most surely applies. There is not one single problem which is common to modern man that has not been covered somewhere in scripture.
