"When The Cares of My Heart Are Many"

One of the most beautiful statements in the Scriptures, or anywhere else, is this one: "When the cares of my heart are many, your consolations cheer my soul" (Ps. 94:19). It is also one of the most needed in human experience.

The cares mentioned here are the thoughts, doubts or anxieties which invade a person's heart and attack his faith. In Psalm 94, these cares especially have to do with the conflict the psalmist felt between his conviction that the mighty Lord reigns (Ps. 93) and his recognition that the arrogant wicked live it up while ignoring Him (Ps. 94:1-7). These are the same anxious thoughts that confront us when we turn from hearing of the love and power of God on Sunday to dealing with the problems and hurts of life on Monday.

The cares of a person's heart can be many. They take the form of doubt about spiritual things, uncertainty about what lies ahead, anger over injustice, fear of threatening circumstances, or grief from bitter disappointments. Every heart knows something of such thoughts.

"But," says the psalmist, "the consolations of God are stronger than these cares." The consolations of God in this Psalm have to do with thoughts of His nature and work in the world. They are the comforts that come from remembering that God is greater than us or our thoughts (v. 8-9), that He disciplines nations and teaches men (v. 10-11), that He stays with His people and gives them rest (v. 12-15), and that He has helped us many times before (v. 16-18).

Reflecting on these matters did not answer all the psalmist's questions, but they cheered his soul. He had God and hope, and that was enough to turn doubt into delight.

Our God is "the Father of mercies and God of all comfort" (2 Cor. 1:3). He does not remove all afflictions from our lives, but He does comfort His people "as one whom his mother comforts" (Is. 66:13). Let us take refuge in Him.



THE QUESTION OF THE AGES

The psalmist asked this question in Psalm 24:8, 10 and as time rolled on it was again asked by the Lord himself in Matthew 16:13. The response which we make today will govern the degree of our happiness as we walk our own road of life. Here's the question: "Who is the King of Glory?" Later, in the New Testament, Jesus asked his disciples virtually the same question. He asked, "Whom do men say that I am?" In answer to this question the apostle Peter acknowledged, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Living God" (Matt. 16:16). Jesus blessed him in making that statement and replied, "....upon this rock I will build my church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matt. 16:18). Moving on in the New Testament we see that promise of Jesus being fulfilled when some three thousand responded in baptism and thus became charter members of the Lord's church. (See Acts 2:37-47). How we answer that question today, in a world filled with many disappointments, miseries and heartaches, might be the difference in our making it through all these obstacles of our lives. . Going back to Psalm 24 we can see more answers to this Question of the Ages. "Who is the King of Glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle" (Psa. 24:8). Since "...it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps" (Jer. 10:23), how comforting it is to know we have the "King of Glory" on our side to lead us into the "green pastures" of our lives (Psa. 23:2).
