They Found Them Gathered Together

A detail from the resurrection account provided by Luke deserves our attention.

It has to be imagined in the light of the bewildering and awesome events and emotions of that particular first day of the week. Strong ripples of shock, grief, confusion, guilt, and fear are being felt among the disciples in the wake of the death and burial of Jesus. Early in the morning, some of the women make their way out to the tomb, find the stone rolled away, but do not find his body. The wondering increases. The day wears away, and Jesus is recognized by two disciples at Emmaus as he blesses bread, breaks it, and gives it to them. These two realize they have been walking and talking with Jesus—who is alive—and he has been explaining the Scriptures to them! The entire mood of the narrative changes drastically. News like this has to be told, so they get up right then and beat it back to Jerusalem, seven miles behind.

That's where we come to this telling statement: "And they found the eleven and those who were with them gathered together" (Lk. 24:33b).

Of course! When we think about it, where else would we expect to find the Lord's people when there is joy to be shared, or confusion to be sorted out, or disappointment to be coped with, or fear to be faced, or responsibility to be borne? Whatever else we might find, we wouldn't be surprised to find them gathered together.

This scene becomes even more meaningful as the New Testament unfolds. We find believers together with their newly embraced faith (Acts 2:44), apostles responding to threatening by going to their friends (Acts 4:23), and workers in behalf of the kingdom gathering together on the first day of the week to break bread (Acts 20:7). Weary Christians are advised, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near" (Heb. 10:24, 25).

There is a natural and practical wisdom about this. Most of us instinctively recognize our need to take joys and sorrows, triumphs and defeats, hopes and doubts to where we know the Lord's people will be found together. Have we thought enough about how badly other people, at certain times in their lives, need to find us together? If they don't, to whom will they go?



With all the many major accidents which have happened around the world in the last several months, I'm beginning to wonder if we possibly have become so hardened to the loss of life that we might have lost whatever compassion we once had toward others.
