THE STRENGTH TO GET THE JOB DONE

Many of the tasks which face us as Christians appear to be too big for us. Just living the life of a Christian is a challenge. Bringing up our children is an awesome responsibility. Being a leader or a teacher of the Lord's people is a fearful undertaking. The mere thought of accomplishing the mission the Lord has assigned to us as his church is mind-boggling. Where will we ever find the strength to accomplish these tasks?

Perhaps we can learn from Joshua. He faced the tremendous task of leading the nation of Israel to take the promised land. (Josh. 1:1-9) God told him several times to "be strong and of good courage." But what are the sources of strength and courage? Here are at least four:

- **1. DUTY.** People today frown on doing things out of a sense of duty. However, the scriptures show that the determination to accomplish one's Godgiven duty is an important source of strength. God commissioned Joshua to take the people over the Jordan and cause them to inherit the Promised land (v. 2, 6). His dedication to his duty made him strong.
- **2. TRUST.** God made four promises to enable Joshua to "be strong and of good courage." He promised that every place the sole of Joshua's feet touched had been given him (v. 3); that none would be able to stand before him (v. 5); that he would be with Joshua wherever he went (v. 5, 9); and that He would not fail or forsake him (v. 5). God has also granted to us exceeding great and precious promises.
- **3. OBEDIENCE.** The only condition God put on His help was that Joshua "observe to do according to all the law" (v. 7). If Joshua would not turn from it to the right hand or the left he could be assured of prosperity and good success. No man has ever been defeated by obeying God. We can be strong and courageous by obeying God's word.
- **4. PERSEVERANCE.** The greatest enemies of strength and courage are fear and discouragement. The only way to overcome them is to "keep on keeping on." Joshua was to "be not affrighted, neither be ... dismayed" (v. 9). More than we have ever realized, strength comes from steadfastly continuing in God's way.

Joshua found the strength and courage to accomplish his task. So can we today - if we will develop these four great qualities of character which made Joshua strong.


