## **God's First Questions**

The first questions of life appear in the third and fourth chapters of Genesis. Our enemy raises one to introduce doubt and an opening for temptation. Especially noteworthy, however, is the series of questions God asks once sin has entered human experience. It's not that he doesn't know the answers. It's that he wants persons to grasp reality.

1. "Where are you?" (3:9). This is what one asks of somebody when he wants to help that person. It's also the first thing a person has to answer to himself before he can ever do any better. It's not about where I have been or where I plan to go. The question is where I am.

2. "Who told you?" (3:13). In other words, what authority have I been listening to? By what standard have I been determining reality? Who we are willing to listen to–why we think what we do–is as important as what we think or do.

3. "What have you done?" (3:13). Not, what has someone else done? Not, what has been done to me? Rather, can I offer a candid statement of the facts of my own actions with no attempt to spin them? We will all finally be judged according to what we have done.

4. "Why are you angry?" (4:6). There is reason for concern when anger becomes my settled mood. When it does, it may be more because of what I am than because of what has been done to me (cf. 1 Jn. 3:12). The first thing to do with an emotion is to examine what really brought it on.

5. "Where is your brother?" (4:9). How I handle this question says so much about my heart. Do I care about people or about things? Do I have any awareness of anyone but myself? Am I capable of loving God and my neighbors? Each one is responsible for his own part in any relationship.

Aren't these still really the first questions of life? Our answers to God open our eyes to our real condition and open our hearts to his grace.



### SOMETIMES THERE IS DANGER IN LOOKING BACK

Most of us have the habit of looking back at times when we were younger and things seemed less serious. This is especially true for those of us who are older. But there is a danger in doing this if we are not careful. Consider these words of Jesus: "No man, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back is fit for the kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62). The Hebrews writer also gives us something to think about here: "Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him" (Heb. 10:38). Again, let us listen to the words of Jesus: "If you continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed" (John 8:31). Surely all would agree that these passages have reference to our spiritual life. Faith in God and His saving grace is most wonderful as well as comforting. However, let us not be so comfortable that we forget the possibility of apostasy - more commonly known as "falling from grace." No where is this thought more forthright than the following: "For if after they have escaped the pollution of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning" (2nd Pet. 2:20-22). Here the scriptures use the return of a dog to his vomit and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire. How Sad!
