#### "BLESSED ARE THE EYES THAT SEE WHAT YOU SEE!"

It happened at one of the high points in the Lord's ministry. Those to whom he had given authority over all the power of the enemy had returned with joyful reports of the success of what they had been doing in his name (Lk. 10:17). This had caused Jesus to rejoice in the Holy Spirit, and to thank the Father who is Lord of heaven and earth for what he saw occurring (v. 21). But notice this next detail: "Then turning to the disciples he said privately, 'Blessed are the eyes that see what you see! For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it'" (v. 23-24).

Why did the Lord feel the need to make this point to his friends at such a moment? One possibility is that he knew they might not have recognized the significance of what was happening. The report of the seventy had caused Jesus to say, "I saw Satan fall like the lightening from heaven" (v. 17). The inroads which had been made into the enemy's territory were hints of what would be completed when he, through his death and resurrection, would invade the strong man's house and took away his power (Lk. 11:21-22).

Another possibility is that Jesus understood the human tendency to take for granted that with which we have grown familiar, and that he was not willing for his friends to fall victim to that habit by overlooking the tremendous value of the blessing they were experiencing. This is an important line of thought in the New Testament, and it is a lesson we still need, perhaps even more urgently than they did.

Those who stood there with Jesus were being privileged to see the fulfillment of promises many great people of faith had greeted from afar, but had died without receiving (Heb. 11:13). The courageous prophets who even spoke of the grace they were seeing had searched and inquired diligently of its time and the subsequent glories (1 Pet. 10-11). Things into which angels long to look were being revealed (1 Pet. 1:12). Truly, eyes that are granted the opportunity to see such things are blessed!

Think of what that means to us. We enjoy the privilege of looking into the mystery of the eternal God which was kept secret for long ages, but is now disclosed wherever the gospel is taught (Rom. 16:25-27). No response fits such a blessing except the joyful and grateful obedience of faith, celebrated forevermore.



#### GOD WORKS ALL TO OUR GOOD

In a world of sickness, sorrow, heartache and even sin, sometimes we are made to wonder just where is God. But my friends, let us put that thought completely out of our mind because God is where he always has been and where he always will be and that is to give love and comfort to his beloved people. Having said that, please read the following slowly and thoughtfully. "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28, NKJV). Did you notice that the article "the" was printed in bold face and underlined? This is not true in a number of translations. In fact, it is not there at all. Maybe this is a small matter and with referencing other kindred passages it probably doesn't matter. However, we need to understand that "many are called, but few are chosen" (Matt. 20:16). In other words, "God is not willing that any should perish" (2<sup>nd</sup> Pet. 3:9). Therefore, the gospel message was designed that those who hear the message and respond to the message will be chosen by God. When this happens, those who have responded and live faithfully thereafter become recipients of God's promises. They have become "the called" of God and are worthy of this beautiful promise - - even in this life. You see, God has promises to all, but not all will respond to his promises. In like manner, not everyone has the promise in Romans 8:28 unless they have become one of "the called" of God. Think this out!
