Roots of Our Dream

Our dream is just to be Christians, not hyphenated by denominational preferences, yet identifiable by loyalty to the way of the Lord. Four significant feeders of this way of thinking are noticeable in the profoundly meaningful Farewell Discourse and High Priestly Prayer of Jesus, which we have been reading from John 13-17

First, there is our Lord's fervent desire for unity among his people. "That they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me," he prays (17:20). His will is that "they may become perfectly one" in such a way that "the world may know" (17:23). Surely this calls for convictions, practices, and behaviors that are held in common.

Second, there is the one-time office of the apostles, with its permanent authority and its formative influence in the life of the church. Christ tells them, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth...he will bear witness about me...he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (16:13; 15:26; 14:26). The apostles were to be empowered to speak with an authority that is foundational. Ever since, it has been necessary that we not drift away from what we have heard.

Third, there is the promise of bearing fruit by abiding in him. "Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit," he says (15:5). The imperative is that we abide in him. Fruit is not manufactured; it is borne through life drawn from the Vine under the care of the Gardener. Abiding involves allowing his word to come alive in us, engaging in the discipline of prayer, and taking joy in keeping his commandments.

Fourth, there is tone of the disposition and the character that is shared among people who belong to Christ. It is marked by love of Christ and of one another (15:9, 10, 17), by substantive joy (15:11), by moral cleanness (15:3), by spiritual peace (14:27), and by calm strength that copes with life and its troubles (14:1).

When these four rich veins are drawn upon concurrently, they nourish a hardy and beautiful living organism: a body of New Testament Christians. A faithful congregation of the Lord's people—that is what we want to be!



Could "Old Sayings" Have Been Born of Scripture?

I'll answer my own question here by saying "I doubt it." However, there are many "Old Sayings" that run in parallel with some very true to life inspired scripture. For example, "We must not wear our welcome out!" Compare that with "Withdraw thy foot from thy neighbor's house; lest he be weary of thee, and so hate thee" (Prov. 25:17). Another Old Saying goes like this: "You mustn't meddle in the business of others." The parallel is great - "He that passeth by, and meddleth with strife belonging not to him, is like one that taketh a dog by the ears" (Prov. 26:17). Here's another which we probably use a lot, "I would not know what to say." The wise man of old gives us the answer "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver" (Prov. 25:11). They go on and on - "You're standing in deep water." Check this out - "Counsel in the heart of man is like deep water; but a man of understanding will draw it out" (Prov. 20:5). I like the following also especially in driving our cars today - "Safety First!" I'm sure that Solomon never saw an automobile, but he did understand the purpose of the horse: "The horse is prepared against the day of battle: but safety is of the Lord" (Prov. 21:31). We'll close with - "Watch your reputation!" Good advice - "A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches, and loving favor rather than silver and gold" (Prov. 22:1).
