We Must Take Time To Pray!

In 1948, L. O. Sanderson wrote a verse we want to bear in mind while we are trying to read the Scriptures each day. It is in his wonderful song "Pray All the Time."

The Father speaketh in His word – He talks no other way! And to converse with Him, our Lord, We must take time to pray!

As much as we must listen to our Father each day, so do we need to speak to him in prayer.

Prayer and the intention to live in keeping with what the Lord says go together. As Paul puts it, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Peter tells us to cast our anxieties on God, to resist the evil one, be firm in our faith, and to stand firm in his true grace. John says, "And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us."

Prayer is done with reference to Jesus Christ. Whatever we ask of the Father, we must ask in the name of his Son. We pray with respect to Christ, according to his nature and teaching, and as an act of faithfulness to his mission and submission to his will. When we pray in the name of Christ, we are drawing near to our Father on the basis of the relationship established by the Son, and through his mediation.

In this way, to pray is to participate in the rich privileges of being in Christ. It is to address God in the same way Jesus did, as Father. We call on his Father as our Father, with the same "Abba, Father" spirit as Jesus. We approach him as trusting children, nothing doubting. We ask for the best for all, over time.

Prayer may be thought of as the most important part of our work. It is the discipline by which spirituality meets reality. All the joys, sorrows, needs, and concerns of life are appropriate subjects of it, all the way from the highest glory of God to the deepest need of man. As brother Sanderson puts it:

Family Bible Time Tonight at 5 p.m.

There is no trial, grief, or pain, No moment of the day, But what we may in Jesus' name Incline our hearts to pray.



"<u>NO KING BUT CAESAR" - (John 19:15)</u>

In reading the four gospels it is evident that during the life of Jesus Christ there was no love lost between the powers of Rome and the common Jewish men in the Provence of Judea. Taxation by the Romans was heavy as can be seen in passages like Luke 2:1-4 and5 However, in spite of this burden on the Jews, the Roman government allowed them to run their religious beliefs and convictions by their own laws. It is so interesting to see that friendship - or the lack of it - can be very shallow depending on the circumstances of the times. Looking at Luke 23:12, there had been some "misunderstandings" between the Roman governor, Pilate, and the Jewish king, Herod. Whatever that might have been, this text shows that they became friends in a combined effort to crucify Jesus. Quoting Clarke's Commentary, "Wicked men cannot love one another: this belongs to the disciples of Christ. But when Christ, his truth, or his followers are to be persecuted, for this purpose the wicked unite their counsels and their influence." This has been proved many times in the history of our world. Notice these words, "It is true, however, that wicked people, at variance in other things, are often united in opposing and ridiculing Christ and his followers" (Albert Barnes Commentary). That being said, while Christians are to "honor the king" (1st Peter 2:17), we must not allow our civic duties to overshadow our allegiance to "Christ the King"(Mk 15:32; Luke 23:2).
