You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)



"Her Children Rise Up And Call Her Blessed"

Unless we are completely heartless and selfish, it will happen: the children of a worthy woman will bless their mother, and their father will praise her (Prov. 31:28). That is certainly what should happen. "Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised" (Prov. 31:30).

What is there about a woman who lives in reverence for God which makes her so praiseworthy? For one thing, there are few things in human experience as strong as the character of such a woman. "Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come" (Prov. 31:25). She is to be honored because she is honorable.

Also, her view of all of life as a gift of the LORD produces an amazing array of interests and ingenuity on her part. "She looks well to the ways of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness" (Prov. 31:27). She puts her hands to whatever needs to be done (v. 12f), and her works praise her (v. 31).

Her strength and diligence, however, do not make her harsh. Her greatness lies in the fact that her character and commitment are accompanied by a wonderful capacity for compassion. "She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue" (Prov. 31:26). A godly woman brings tenderness into the lives of those around her.

These qualities together make her worthy of the complete trust of her husband, children and neighbors (cf. Prov. 31:11). Confidence is characteristic of *them* because of *her*.

In fact, it might be said that any honor which comes into *their* lives is actually traceable to her (cf. Prov. 31:23). The extent of the influence of a worthy woman is unimaginable.

Any woman should seek to be a woman who fears the LORD. But any woman who does so is "far more precious than jewels" (v. 10), and she should be treated as if her value is recognized.


