He Was Praying

It is fascinating to look in on our Lord at prayer. It is also an enlightening and encouraging privilege. We are surely upon holy ground.

Though he had authority to command and to be obeyed by both the natural world and the spirit world (Mk. 1:22-27; 4:39-41), he prayed. That must mean that prayer is about something more than getting what we want. It is about drawing near to the heart of the Father and communing with Him.

Though people for whom he had compassion were all around and there was so much to do (Mk. 1:32-34, 40-41), he prayed. He put prayer before their demands. That reminds us that our purpose is not just to get something done. It is to be someone who walks with God.

Though things were happening one after the other, immediately, and he could have used the rest, he prayed. In fact, he got up before daylight and went out to pray. That teaches us that praying is not an "if we get around to it" activity. It comes first and makes a difference in everything else.

Jesus practiced what he preached. He taught that we ought always to pray (Lk. 18:1), and he always did. He said that we should pray to the Father who sees in secret (Matt. 6:6), and he went to a secluded place to pray. His way was to trust the Father and then turn to face the responsibilities of life, just as he required of us (Matt. 7:7-11).

Today let God say something to you as you read His word. Say something for God through some service for Him. But, above all, make sure you say something to God in prayer.

Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving. Colossians 4:2
