Hope Has a Reason

I'm writing this Thursday evening, January 28, 2016. Thirty years ago today, not far past mid-morning, I was standing in a hospital room at Cox North visiting someone. The TV up in the corner was on, and suddenly the programming was interrupted by a special report delivered in a very sober news voice. An eerie scene appeared on screen: the tentacle-shaped plumes of smoke left from the catastrophic explosion of the space shuttle Challenger.

It's odd how there are moments like that in your life that stay with you. One thing that struck me was something said by the reporter that morning. It was impossible to look on that picture without contemplating the fate of the seven crew members, one of whom was a teacher. The newsman observed, "We all hope for the well-being of everyone on board, but at this point we don't have much reason to expect it."

Many times since, I have thought of the implications of that comment. Hope without a reason is a tragedy. Hope without a reason is an unfounded wish, fashioned in the shadow of dread, and expressed in preparation for heartbreak.

How different is the hope of the gospel! It is a deep desire for a known object along with a solid reason for expecting to possess it. God has loved us and given us good hope through grace, to which he has called us through the gospel. Our blessed hope springs from the grace that brought salvation at our Lord's first appearing, and it awaits the glory of his appearing again. Our Father has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, and it is kept in heaven for us. Jesus has already gone there as a forerunner on our behalf, bearing our hope, which we have as a sure and steadfast anchor of our souls.

Christian hope has a reason—a sufficient one. The time will come for us when this one thing will be all that matters.
