ARE WE TRUTHFUL IN OUR SINGING? By Dennis R. Smith

The Apostle Paul, in his instructions concerning the public worship, made the following statement: "... I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also" (1st Cor. 14:15b). The purpose of this article is to focus on the word "understanding" in the above text. Do we really understand its full meaning? As we sing many of the beautiful hymns of the church and call out the wording which relates great lessons to us, are we truthful to the song and more especially are we truthful with ourselves and to God?

Taking a break here we will go back to the word "understand." In the King James version of the Bible this word and its derivatives appear over 300 times. Let's take a look at some of these: "Wherefore be ye not unwise, but <u>understanding</u> what the will of the Lord is" (Eph. 5.17). "That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love may be able to comprehend (know- understand) with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God" (Eph. 3:17-19). Even the basic principles of salvation are based on the understanding of what is taught from the scriptures. "No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day. It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me" (John 6:44-45).

Making application to the above and the title of this article, let's take the beautiful and informative song "I Love Thy Kingdom Lord." I wonder sometimes if we fully understand what the kingdom is and if we do, are we actually truthful in singing "I love thy Kingdom, Lord?" Based on Matthew 3:2 as well and 4:17, both John the baptist and Jesus declare "...for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" The meaning here is that the kingdom was yet to come. After the beginning of the church (Acts 2) the kingdom is spoken of in the present tense (Colossians 1:13). In short, the bible teaches that the kingdom and the church are one and the same. Since this is true, we must go a few steps further and <u>understand</u> that Christ's church and Christ's kingdom is composed of people. **Point of Fact!** In keeping with 1st John 4:20, how can we sing **"I Love Thy Kingdom,** Lord" and at the same time have no love for some of the people in the church? "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? This scripture calls that man a "liar!" One final question: Which is worse to CALL a man a liar or to SING a lie in the presence of God as we attempt to offer our worship to Him "..in spirit and in **TRUTH**" (John 4:24)?
