"As For Man..."

A Meditation on Psalm 103

The one hundred third Psalm is a treasure. It is known and celebrated for its first and last lines, its spirit of "Bless the LORD, O my soul!" Surely it is right that a song written in this mood should impress us and move us. What other response to a survey of all his benefits, his righteous and just ways, his merciful and gracious nature, and his lasting rule over his kingdom could possibly be appropriate? The LORD has definitely shown himself to be worthy of the "and all that is within me, bless his holy name!" in the first verse of the psalm.

But the heart of Psalm 103 is not a sentimental counting of God's blessings. Instead, this wonderful hymn of praise is constructed around a poignantly realistic reflection on our own condition as human beings. The essential truth is confronted this way: "As for man, his days are like grass; he flourishes like a flower of the field; for the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place knows it no more" (v. 18-19). There is no getting around the sobering reality, and we are hardly prepared to live until we face it.

The movements of the psalm take their power from this recognition that our lives here are brief, uncertain, and temporary. When all the LORD'S benefits are surveyed—and they are both many and profound—the culmination is "so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's" (v. 5). When the expressions of his steadfast love are observed, the ultimate demonstration of his compassion is that "he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust" (v. 14). When the highest of his gifts to those who keep his covenant is named, it is a contrast to our as-for-man condition: "But the steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear him, and his righteousness to children's children' (v. 17).

In what other way can my life have meaning when I am gone? His angels do his word. His hosts do his will. All his works bless him. May my soul do likewise!


