Upset!

With regard to the outcome of the national election, "upset" seems to be the right word—and in more ways than one. It obviously was not what most of the pollsters, predictors, or commentators expected. We are hearing some call it the biggest upset in American history. And, in the aftermath, we are seeing from some another kind of upset: the kind expressed by either heartbroken tears, panicked fears, or angry jeers.

This might be a good time for us to pause and reflect a bit. Here are some thoughts about living in our country that impress me now even more than usual.

Obviously none of us always know, much less have control over, how things like this in civic life are going to turn out. This is so even with all our means of organizing, persuading, or measuring. Isn't it therefore folly for any of us to allow our entire mood and our whole outlook on life be determined by political outcomes—or for that matter, by anything that can change so quickly and unpredictably?

And, isn't there wisdom in constitutionally based, rather than personality invested, government? After all, whatever power one executive has to simply do things on his own authority may well one day be in the hands of another with a very different outlook. We might do well to give thanks for, and to be more careful about, our form of government.

But government is not God. This truth needs to be impressed upon all our minds, whether we are on the right or the left. Neither political leaders nor parties are worthy of religious devotion. The more the secular world makes government a god, the more approaches to elections take on a religious fervor, and the more reactions to their not going as someone wants are apocalyptic.

It would help if we would regard persons as individually and equally responsible to God. When we have gone about the whole thing by lumping people into blocks, then assigning motives and moral standing to all of them as groups, pitting entire groups against each other, it will be impossible not to be "upset" if someone else wins.

Of course we have convictions, opinions, and preferences about these matters. But our tasks Wednesday morning were the same as Tuesday morning: to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbors as ourselves.
