### A Light for the Nations

A beautiful, very encouraging, and badly needed illustration has been prominent in our daily Bible readings. It offers us a way of appreciating the work of Christ and understanding the role his people have in the world.

It is the picture Matthew uses as the transition from the tempting of Jesus to the beginning of his ministry in Galilee. "The people dwelling in darkness have seen a great light," he says, "and for those dwelling in the region and shadow of death, on them a light has dawned." What a wonderful picture of emerging hope!

The vision being fulfilled is a long-treasured promise from Isaiah. A son is given to govern his everlasting kingdom with justice and righteousness, a great light in the deep darkness. A servant is given as a covenant for the people and a light for the nations, opening blind eyes and bringing prisoners out of dark dungeons. By making him a light for the nations, the LORD makes his salvation reach to the end of the earth, displaying his own bright glory.

That is what the appearing of Jesus means. By the tender mercy of God, the sunrise from on high visits us to give light to those who sit in the dark shadow of death and to guide our feet in the way of peace. In him the salvation God has prepared in the presence of all peoples shines like a light for revelation to the nations and for glory to his people. He is liberty to captives, sight to the blind, and good news to the oppressed.

His church consists of those who gladly receive this news, and it exists to help the nations see him that way too. He makes his people heirs of light as he delivers them from the domain of darkness and transfers them into his kingdom by means of redemption and forgiveness. He asks them to not walk in darkness, but to follow him and to have the light of life. He then sends them with good news to open the eyes of others so they may turn from darkness to light and share the same inheritance.

This view of "a light for the nations" has its greatest meaning as the world runs its course and the purposes of God are completed. The city of God appears, and by its light the nations walk. The glory and honor of the nations are brought into it, but nothing unclean. The tree of life is there, and its leaves are for the healing of the nation. Why? Because the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb. Those who are written in the Lamb's book of life will see his face, and night will be no more.

Whatever darkness comes in between, rest assured that when that time comes the Lord's people will indeed have seen a great light!
