Connective Tissue of Collective Praise

Though it may seem a strange place to find a heartwarming, dramatic story, Exodus 17, from last week's Bible reading, holds such an account. The people of God had finally left Egypt, with Moses at the helm—they crossed the Red Sea, they received water from the rock and manna from heaven. They came to a place called Rephidim, where they encountered their first real trouble—the Amalekites, who came to make war with them. In a somewhat strange course of events, the people are sent to battle and Moses to the mountaintop, holding the rod of God and watching the battle below. "And so it was when Moses held up his hand, that Israel prevailed; and when he let down his hand, Amalek prevailed" (17:11).

Where is the touching portion of this story? Read on: "But Moses' hands became heavy; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. And Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; and his hands were steady until the going down of the sun. So [they] defeated Amalek" (17:12, 13). For the people of God to prevail, the rod of God had to be held high, but for that to happen, Moses needed his friends, there to sit on either side, holding his hands up. How beautiful an image!

Couple this beautiful story with the message of the great call to worship, Psalm 95, our Bible reading for the next day. A range of emotions is encouraged. "Come let us sing... and shout joyfully to the Rock of our salvation..." (95:1). Followed by a more somber, "Come let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord..." (95:6). But the Psalm is not just a call to worship, but a call to heed the Lord's voice. "We are the people of His pasture, the sheep of His hand... Do not harden your hearts..." We are His sheep, we just listen to His voice! It is a message that connects worship in community with faithfulness to His calling.

Reading Exodus 17 and Psalm 95 together this week was an exercise in being reminded of the importance of "<u>Us</u>." Not individually, though we certainly have an identity which is unique and special in the eyes of the Lord. But I am reminded of the importance of "<u>Us</u>" as a group, and of the importance of the unity and relationships we share collectively. These two passages remind me that I need people to "hold up my hands." Being with, and worshiping the Lord with, people who share my faith and values and love for the Lord reinforce my ability to function as a spiritual person through the week, to not let the world "harden [my] heart."

Togetherness and community in worship is intimately with tied the ability we all have to keep going, to withstand the devil's devices, to show grace and mercy, to express joy and thanksgiving, and so many more things. There is a connective tissue in our collective praise that we offer together, to the Lord. May we never forget the importance of always be impressed with the power and importance of "Us."

THE BEAUTY OF THE LORD

From that beautiful 90th Psalm at verse 17 we find these words: "And let the beauty of the LORD our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us; yea, the work of our hands establish thou it." In this short verse we find two outstanding thoughts. (1) The beauty of Jesus can be seen in many things. (2) That any work of the church by any of its members must be sought with the same dedication, integrity, modesty and love befitting the beauty of Jesus. We often sing "Let the Beauty of Jesus Be Seen in Me." Much could be said about that last statement, but let it suffice to say again from another appropriate song, "We Bow Down." In other words our daily lives and for sure our assembly together demands that we render proper obeisance to the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords. Remember, we are to "present our bodies as a living sacrifice" (Rom. 12:1). What better way for us to do this than to present our best spiritually and otherwise. It has been said that water seeks its own level. That being the case, if the Beauty of the Lord can be seen in all the things which he stands for - the church - the holy scriptures - the promise of heaven - and blessings upon top of blessings, surely we want him to see the best of beauty in ourselves. Food for thought: "But let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price" (1st Peter 3:4).
