What is Better than Smelling the Roses?

Surely we have all heard the old expression, "better stop and smell the roses." This, of course, has reference to the thought of slowing down and quit pushing life for things that really are not all that important. That is good advice, but there is something that precedes our doing so which is more important by far in the long run.

To answer this question I will refer you to the Psalm 46:10: "Be still, and know that I am God." In the most part the rose is a symbol of love and beauty. Many songs have been written about the rose and then there's the famous quote by Shakespeare, "A Rose by any other name would smell as sweet." As far as I can tell there are only two times in the Bible where the rose is mentioned. They are as follows: "..... and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose (Isa. 35:1).I am the rose of Sharon, and the lily of the valleys" (Song of Sol. 2:1). Both of these are metaphors relating either directly or indirectly to Jesus himself or the peace and serenity of his kingdom.

Now, what is better than smelling the roses? The answer is to stop and acknowledge that the God of heaven, who is the creator of all things, has brought the rose into being and many other beautiful things which we enjoy. While it might help us to stop and view all these things, it is better that we understand "all things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made" (John 1:3). The first order of business then is to "be still and know God."
