The Nature and Value of Spirituality

The concept of spirituality is, or should be, precious to us. The realm of the spiritual is unseen and lasting, as opposed to natural and temporary. Spiritual things are those which have their origin in God, are in harmony with his character, and reflect his purposes. Spirituality has to do with aspiring to the kingdom of God and his righteousness rather than being consumed with appetites and appearances.

There is something we should notice, however, while we are reading First Corinthians. More than half the references to the "spiritual" in the New Testament are in it. Our brothers and sisters in the Lord at Corinth were in pursuit of spirituality, and perhaps even regarded themselves as having achieved it. What is clear from this letter, though, is that they had a mistaken view of the nature of spirituality. In fact, that misunderstanding was at the root of many problems they were experiencing and it is one of the main things Paul addresses in the letter.

First Corinthians reminds us that there must ever be three great marks of Christian spirituality. One is respect for the authority of the Lord's word that can take in the truths it teaches and make proper application to life. A spiritual person will take notice of the things the apostle has written and will acknowledge them as commands of the Lord (14:37). He will understand the life principles these writings teach, and he will be developing an ability to discern the wise application of them (2:14-15).

The second indication of spirituality is upright character. A spiritual person does not behave merely in a human way, and he is not motivated by the ordinary jealousies of the flesh (3:3). In another letter, the apostle points out that if an individual is actually led by the Spirit and is walking by the Spirit, the fruit of the Spirit will be found in him. His lifestyle will be dominated by love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control, and such traits as these (Gal. 6:22-23).

A third mark of real spirituality is meeting one's responsibility toward others in a loving manner. The spiritual person is neither preoccupied with his own experiences nor acclaim for his own ability. Instead, he is interested in allowing others to be guided by the Word and to bear the fruit of the Spirit. His is the more excellent way: he loves. "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth" (12:31; 13:4-6).

I have an idea that if we would allow these three guidelines to define spirituality for us, we would have many fewer problems.


