Stories of the Gardening Season

The evidence is that the Lord meant for us to identify with the gardening process. The church is like a field that God works (cf. 1 Cor. 3:6-9). Not only are our lives like soil being tended to produce a crop, but we are also his hands to help with the sowing, watering, and necessary garden chores. It's a picture with much to contribute to our understanding of ourselves.

This, then, is our time of the year. The garden section of every home store is stocked to overflowing. Neighbors all around are preparing the ground, marking off rows or beds, and choosing varieties of seeds (or plants started from them), all in anticipation of the harvest. We may well think on the spiritual truths being demonstrated as this happens.

Jesus did that very thing as he taught in the fourth chapter of Mark. He was sitting in a boat and the crowd was spread out on the land before him. Maybe they looked to him like a garden coming up. Whether that was the reason or not, he used stories of the garden to illustrate what occurs as persons hear the word of his kingdom (cf. v. 14).

Like a seed, the word has life in it (Mk. 4:26-29). Because it does, it can sprout and grow by itself, developing into a sprout, then becoming a mature plant, then bearing fruit. The gardener plants it, tends it, and goes about his business, but he knows the power is in the seed.

As a seed seems a small and insignificant beginning, so the life of the kingdom of God does not develop from humanly impressive events (Mk. 4:30-32). It has a far-reaching impact over time because of who rules it and because of what it is, not because of what people think of it.

Just as all seeds do, what the seed of the kingdom ultimately brings forth depends on the kind of soil upon which it falls (Mk. 4:13-20). A hearer may leave the word on the surface, allowing Satan to take it away before it has any impact. One may have an initial interest, but not enough depth to sustain life through the dry seasons. Another may take the word in only to allow the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches and the desire for other things to choke it out. But there will also be good hearts who hear the word, accept it, and bear fruit in keeping with their opportunity.

The stories of the garden allow us to be both realistic and hopeful, not only with regard to the word of the kingdom in our own lives but also with regard to our efforts to sow it in the lives of others. We are reminded that our first task is always to pay attention to what we hear (Mk. 4:24-25). That is where all growth starts.
