RCH OF CHRIST

What moves the ministry of the Lord's people along? What needs or desires cause a healthy church to serve and to keep serving? Some appropriate answers become apparent as Paul begins his letter to the Romans.

An intention to introduce the grace and peace of God into the experience of fellow human beings (1:7). All of them are loved by him. He is calling them to be his own. He wants the best for them.
A sense of gratitude that there are people whose faith is known in the world (1:8). If there are faithful people who are active in less than ideal circumstances, thanks for them is due, and fellowship with them in it is fitting.

3. A desire to strengthen and encourage fellow believers in their faith, and to be strengthened by theirs (1:11-12). The longing to be together and to bless each other sustains the vitality of the church's ministry.

4. An interest in a harvest (1:13). Such an interest arises from abiding in Christ, the true vine, and from being tended by the Father, the vine dresser, and from living to bear fruit to his glory.

5. An obligation, and an eagerness to fulfill it (1:14-15). Any recipient of grace is under an obligation. Anyone set apart for responsibility is even more so. In both ways, Paul was eager to bring about the obedience of faith among everyone.

6. A confidence in something that will help (1:16-17). The gospel is the power of God to save. It will help anyone who believes it. In it, something is revealed that is not to be found anywhere else: the righteousness of God. This conviction rightly produces many good words and works.

7. A recognition of the great need (1:18f). What happens in society as people are abandoned to ungodliness and unrighteousness is described realistically here. But it is not just a word about how bad things are. It is also a demonstration of the necessity of the ministry of the Lord's people.
