The Coronavirus

We've heard the term used often enough and urgently enough that it now has an ominous aura of its own. "Coronavirus risk at very high global level," one headline proclaims. "How to prepare your home and protect yourself from the coronavirus," another advises. Worries range from containing the spread to speeding up treatments to managing interruptions.

What concerns you most in all this? Is it what you actually know about illness the virus may cause? Is it the hype? The drop in the market? Who will gain or lose political ground over it? The cost? Or people who actually get sick?

One thing especially thought-provoking to me is the emphasis on being adequately prepared. With regard to this virus, of course, I want to know whether we can be, and how. More broadly, though, it is related to the necessity I am asking people to consider when I speak to them of the Lord's way. Life is, after all, temporary, brief, and uncertain, and it will be followed by judgment. Making preparation is everyone's ultimate concern.

The difference—and it's a huge and wonderful one—is that when I speak to anyone of the gospel, I get to tell him or her that it is possible to be prepared, not merely against loss, but for life, for good, forever. I can say that because of who the Lord is, and because of what he has done, is doing, and will do. His once-for-all work is enough, is for anyone who will let it be, and is sufficient each day. All his enemies will finally be put under his feet, even the last and worst one.

Viruses are realities of life. They remain so for those who are in Christ. What they no longer are, however, is cause for the thoughtless panic that might otherwise take over.


