# A TREE OF LIFE

"The tree of life" is crucial to the story the Bible tells. In the beginning the account, fallen man is denied access to the tree which was in the midst of the garden (Gen. 2:9; 3:22). At the conclusion of the record, redeemed man is granted the right to the tree of life again, and pronounced blessed (Rev. 2:7; 22:2, 14).

In between, however, the phrase "tree of life" appears only in the book of Proverbs. In contrast to "the tree of life," which has to do with our eternal fellowship with God, "a tree of life" speaks of things which are sources of the kind of life we were meant to live in this world. The phrase symbolizes those qualities which add beauty, joy, strength and meaning to human experience.

Wisdom is a tree of life in this sense. Proverbs says of wisdom, "She is a tree of life to those who lay hold of her; those who hold her fast are called blessed" (3:18). They are blessed because they can tell the difference between right and wrong, but still with a spirit which is "first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere" (Js. 3:18). Such an individual both finds life and obtains the favor of the Lord (Prov. 8:25).

His influence becomes a tree of life to others, too. "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, and whoever captures souls is wise" (Prov. 11:30). A good man's example and teaching enriches the lives of those around him. His words and deeds are like the fruits of a tree which nourish many souls and lead them to God, turning them into sources of blessing to many others.

Especially of his words is this true. "A gentle tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit" (Prov. 15:4). Harsh words have broken many a heart, but kind and thoughtful talk has a healing effect. Wholesome speech is a source of grace and encouragement, refreshing and building up those who hear (Eph. 4:29).

Living like this tends to fulfill us. "Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a desire fulfilled is a tree of life" (Prov. 13:12). Few things are as disheartening as dashed hopes, but when our deepest longings are met it is as satisfying and refreshing to our souls as fresh, ripe fruit is to a hungry man.

If you want to really live, seek wisdom, bear fruit, speak gently, and have a secure hope. You will find them all in Christ.
