The Lord Knows

Happy New Year to all of you! I wonder who I'll come in contact with, and what will happen, and how my life will change this year, don't you? This time last year, I don't think I would have guessed what the year was going to bring.

Maybe that's why one thing that stands out to me in the first two chapters of John is that the Lord knows. It's clearly something about Jesus that John wants us to think about. It both encourages me and challenges me.

The Lord knows who people are—not just their names, but also their character, their nature, and their strengths. This is the thing about Jesus that so impressed Nathanael that he declared Jesus to be the Son of God (Jn. 1:47-49).

The Lord knows how to act for the good of people. At the Cana wedding, his mother brought a family's awkward need to him, and she simply said to the servants who were there, "Do whatever he tells you" (2:5). That was enough, too. What he did was in everyone's best interest.

The Lord knows why some things should happen in his Father's house, and why some things shouldn't. He acts on that knowledge, too. His "do not make my Father's house a house of trade" turns out to be a point quite dramatically made (2:14-16). What belongs in the Father's house is love for the Father and devotion to him (2:17).

The Lord knows what is in people. In fact, John says "he knew all people" and that he "knew what was in man" (2:24-25). Unfortunately, the point he is making is that Jesus knew all of us well enough not to entrust himself to any of us.

Yet, he goes about making the invisible God known to us, and giving the right to become his children (1:12, 18). He knows what he will do, and what it will cost him, and what the outcome will be (1:51; 2:17, 19).

I want to try to approach all the things about this New Year that I don't know in the light of all the things the Lord does know. I think that will make all the difference.
