That the World Might Not Remain in Darkness

A premise of the Gospel of John is that Christ comes to people who're already lost in order to save them. It's not that everyone's doing just fine, then he shows up but many aren't open to him, and because of that they're under judgment. Instead, he comes to save a world that's condemned, and, if it remains so, it's because it prefers the way it is over the only thing that could rescue it (Jn. 3:17-19). Jesus himself says simply, "I have come into the world as light, so that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness" (12:46).

Individuals may feel their "lostness" and recognize their need for "saving" in different ways. Jesus inevitably does come into conflict with those who like to think they need no saving (cf. 8:33, 39). But as we read John, we also meet people along the way who realize things aren't okay, and come seeking more. It's interesting and instructive to notice why.

For respectable Nicodemus, it seems to happen because his sense of awe in the presence of someone who is greater than himself. He comes to Jesus by night and says, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him" (3:2). His wonder at the presence of holiness and his interest in the kingdom was making him examine his own standing.

With the Samaritan woman, it's facing broken relationships, and a messed up life, and being discounted by other people, that leads her to ask Jesus to quench her thirsts (4:15). It means bringing barriers of race, morality, and class to Jesus, but her thirst is so strong, and her estimation of him is so high, that she does it anyhow.

The official at Capernaum sees his limitations and realizes his need in another way. It's urgent, immediate, and profound. His son is ill and is at the point of death (4:46-47). No one has to tell him something has to be done. When he hears that Jesus is a little over twenty miles away, he makes the trip and makes his plea, and he takes the Lord at his word.

The Lord came so that we would not have to remain in darkness. Life will make us realize, sooner or later, that's where we've been, and we'll look somewhere for light that can save us. John is telling us it's present in Jesus. "And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light..."
