Will One Thing

Do you ever find yourself confused by the abundance of conflicting opinions—by the heated claims and counterclaims about every issue of life that seem to be swirling around all of us these days? I heard a brother mention in one of our prayers recently that we hear so many things we don't know what to think. I imagine most of us can identify with that confession.

And since we can, there's something about the seventh chapter of John can be of particular benefit to us. The whole chapter is occupied with people's discussions, debates, and divisions over who Jesus is. Within it, I can count more than fifteen different opinions various persons or groups held about him. And not only were these views often contradictory, they were also positions with huge implications—life or death ones. It was an atmosphere of ideas that could've seemed hopelessly confusing.

But Jesus says something that is especially important in such an environment. Where there's so many claims, how's anyone to know what to think–what's really true? "If anyone's will is to do his will, he will know whether the teaching is from God or whether I am speaking on my own authority," the Lord says (Jn. 7:17).

That's as crucial a thing as has ever been said about knowing what's real. Not just if anyone wants to know for knowing's sake. Not merely if someone wants to be right on a point of fact. But if a person wills one thing –to do the will of God–he will recognize the truth of Jesus when he hears it.

To will this one thing is to be in a position to cut through the confusion in the world of ideas around us. It puts anyone in a spot to realize what people's agendas are, to tolerate people saying what they think, to examine his own thoughts and convictions, to hold himself accountable to truth beyond himself, and to do the right thing.

Will to do his will. That is the fixed point from which we can live well.
