Lazarus Was There

The presence of Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead, is noted specifically several times in John 12. I try to imagine what it must have been like to have him there as I read these scenes. I think about how the other characters and the things they do look in his shadow.

The chief priests and Pharisees were watching so that they might arrest Jesus. Sure enough, he came back to Bethany. But that's where Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead, was (v.1). My guess is that it's hard to arrest a guy when someone he has called out of the tomb is present.

At a dinner where Lazarus was, Mary poured a jar of expensive ointment on Jesus' feet and wiped them with her hair (v.3). With her brother sitting there alive and in their company, it was understandable. After all, how would you show your love to someone who had given your brother back to you?

Judas might have done better if he had thought more about Lazarus' presence in this scene. He smelled the fragrance of the ointment, calculated the cost, and complained that it was a waste (v.4-5). Supposedly he was concerned about what it could've done for the poor. But think about it. If you can't rejoice over a one raised from the dead, how likely is it that you're really going to care for others who are poor?

A large crowd comes out toward Bethany because they've heard not only that Jesus is there, but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead (v.9). Pretty convincing evidence, I'd say. But he can't be just a curiosity, can he? The real issue is the one who raised him. What are you going to do about him?

That's why many were believing in Jesus (v.11). That's also why the chief priests made plans to put Lazarus to death as well (v.10). Seems dumb to me, looking back on it. To kill a guy who has already been brought back from the tomb once? And the fellow who commanded him to come out? It looks like kind of a useless thing to try.

When Jesus enters the Jerusalem on a young donkey, and to shouts of Hosanna, the shadow of Lazarus is still there. The crowd who'd been with Jesus when he called Lazarus out of the tomb continued to bear witness (v.17). They'd seen it happen. They knew everyone should have to think about Jesus as if Lazarus was there—including us.


