# **But Take Heart**

It's the last verse of the farewell discourse, the Lord's three-chapter conversation with the eleven disciples who were left after Judas went out to betray him. That awful night before the cross, between the supper in the upper room and the struggle in the garden, Jesus offers his friends both reality and reassurance. He concludes with, "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world" (Jn. 16:33).

Every disciple of the Lord, not just these eleven, needs the benefit of his final word that night. His "in the world you will have tribulation" proves to be true for all of us in one way or another. We either encounter distress by following him in a world that hated him, or we experience trouble that is common to the human condition.

As it must have been for their small group that night, the Lord's "but take heart" is both somewhat unexpected and so refreshing. The various efforts to translate the phrase give us a better sense of its range of meaning. "But be of good cheer...but take courage...but cheer up...but be courageous," some of them say. The idea is to meet the world with a goodness and strength.

I imagine the friends who were with him that understood the "but" in his saying. "Take heart—after what you've told us what you're going face, and what we're going to have?" I think most of us understand it, too. The world being what it is, if we're going to be able to take heart, we're going to need a good enough reason.

So Jesus provides one. "I have overcome the world...in me you may have peace." The ruler of this world came for him but has nothing in him (14:30). He is the conqueror of sin, having been tempted in every respect as we are, yet without sin (Heb. 4:15). He is therefore the victor over death itself, alive forevermore, having lifted the keys of Death and Hades from the grasp of the one whose slaves we would all otherwise still be.

We have peace in him. Be of good courage.
