Not From Here

Jesus stood before Pilate with the destiny of us all at stake. When he was questioned by that unprincipled regional agent for the Roman emperor, the Lord said, "My kingdom is not of this world... My kingdom is not of this realm...You would have no authority over Me at all, if it had not been given to you from above..." (Jn. 18:36; 19:11; NASB).

As his disciple, what would you have thought? What if you'd been expecting the Messiah to take a stand against the stubbornness and insensitivity of authorities like Pilate? What if you'd been praying for relief from the imperial domination exercised by Tiberius, thinking that's what everyone needed more than anything? What if you'd known that three or four years down the road that very power would be assumed by a mad man like Caligula?

Even more, what if it were clear that, though he gave this answer, he had the power to respond in a much different way? After all, throughout his ministry he demonstrated the courage to confront injustice. Also, only a few days earlier he called a dead man out of his tomb. And, just hours before this conversation he put a man's severed ear back, emphasizing that twelve legions of angels would at once be put at his disposal upon his appeal.

So what's going on here? The possible answers are limited. One is that Jesus doesn't care enough about his own fate or ours to seize the moment and correct the civil inequities in the system. The other is that Jesus sees that our real need is deeper, the evil in our lives and the death in our future, and that he knows such a need requires a remedy no kingdom of this world can provide.

It's the latter. Jesus' answer indicates that he means to give us a more valuable and permanent triumph than one over any system a fellow like Pilate might ever represent. Clean hearts, upright lives, whole relationships, and living hope—that's the interest of a kingdom that's not from here.
