## I Will and I Won't

The Lord's interaction with the unnamed leper who comes near, kneels before him, and begs for his help is a snapshot of his ministry. "If you will, you can make me clean," the poor fellow confidently says (Mk. 1:40). And Jesus, moved with compassion, stretches out his hand and touches the man with a potentially contagious skin disease, saying, "I will; be clean" (Mk. 1:41).

It could be said that our entire hope depends on that "you can/ I will" connection. But it would not be entirely true. And the part that would be left out is observable when first two chapters of Mark are read together. It's that along with the leper's "you can" and Jesus' "I will," there must also be the Lord's "I won't" if there's to be the good news we need.

His "I will" is demonstrated repeatedly. He will identify with people in doing as God says (1:9). He will endure temptation as all people do (1:13). He will bring good news to people and involve people in worthwhile service (1:15, 17). He will teach people the way that's right, and relieve people's hurts, whether spiritual, mental, or physical (1:22, 32-43). He will forgive people (2:5, 10). He will accept people, and relate to them, and treat them like they matter (2:13f).

But it necessitates his "I won't." That's the unspoken reality that is illustrated in these chapters of Mark. He won't be allied with any forces that dishonor God or destroy people (1:23-25). He won't be distracted from prayer or diverted from his purpose (1:35-38). He won't quit because someone doesn't do as he should've (1:43-45). He won't be kept from helping people by unfounded objections or unjust criticisms (2:7-11, 16-17). He won't undervalue appropriateness (2:18-29, 24-28).

The leper's "you can" and Jesus' "I will" were made actual for us by the Lord's "I won't." It was the junction of his "I will" and his "I won't" that cost him what he suffered for us. And the leper's "you can" is why suffering isn't the end of the story.


