## Lord of Life

As I've read Mark 5, I've been thinking about the three people in it who fell down before Jesus. It's interesting to compare and contrast their stories. Though each of them brought trouble to the Lord that was way beyond their own ability, and though their burdens were very different from each other, none of them left with the same problem.

The individuals who fell down before Jesus were themselves quite different from each other. The first fellow had been living out in the tombs, isolated, out of control, injuring himself (v.6). The second man was a ruler of the synagogue, respected, a family man (v.22). The third person was an unnamed woman, private, out of resources, desperate (v.33).

The circumstances these three faced were overwhelming to them, each in its own way, different, yet representative of any of the problems we may meet. One was demon-possessed—in the grip of unclean and powerful forces pursuing their own interests, not his (v.7f). Another was facing the imminent death of his little girl—his only daughter, twelve years old, Luke tells us—and the awful grief that would come with it (v.23). The other was herself suffering much, and had been for twelve years, and was now without resources, only getting worse (v.25-26).

Each of them brought their troubles to the Lord despite the presence of those who didn't accommodate their doing so. Each of them did it on the basis of what they knew or had heard about Jesus. Each one sought his company, told him the truth, and was willing to do as he said. And all of their lives were so much the richer for it—the first with his true best self (v.15), the second with his precious little girl (v.42), and the third with her own well-being (v.34).

There is a message for us in these events. It's not that if we fall down before Jesus, all our problems will go away. It's that when follow Christ, we are following the Lord of life—all of life.
