<u>Greatness</u>

Who is great? It comes up twice in our reading for today. Both times, it's an issue among the Lord's closest disciples. Both times, it's in the immediate shadow of his telling them what he was about to suffer, and that he would rise. And neither time did Jesus just let the question lie there unaddressed.

The question of who is important, and how personal importance is gained, has never ceased to be one that dramatically impacts the course of human behavior. It still does for us. And Jesus' distinctive answer to it still distinguishes those who are imitating him from everyone else.

What did he say about who is great? We might try to express it with our own "amplified version" of his statements here in Mark 9-10. It would go something like this:

"In whatever you do, bear in mind that the Son of God took the form of a servant. He didn't come to get standing for himself, or to be waited on by as many as he could manipulate into letting him have his way. He came giving himself, even his life, in the interest of everyone, to let anyone choose life" (cf. 10:45).

"Let who your Lord is be the thing that determines who you think is great. Remember that it's the world who considers the important ones to be those who have the say and get their way. It can't be that way among you because that's not how your Lord thought or lived. Among you, the great ones must be those who serve everyone" (cf. 10:42-43).

"You will be first in importance when you are last of all, and not until then. And you won't be last of all until you are the servant of all. Start with one little child. Receive that one little one like your Lord would. You'll be receiving the One who sent Him, and you'll be great" (9:33-37).
