### Commendable People

Imagine it. Mark 11 and 12. It's the beginning of that last week for Jesus. The specter of the suffering that will interrupt it hangs over him. He asserts his right to enter the city as the king, to cleanse the temple as his house, and to judge the people's unfruitfulness. The demands upon him are stressful and constant. He deals with dishonest questions, hypocritical traps, and evil rejection. It would have been enough to turn anyone else off on people—ungrateful, insincere, uncaring people.

But not our Lord. In spite of the offenses around him, the burdens within him, and the agony ahead of him, Jesus not only found goodness in people, but even took the time to commend it. That is one thought provoking—astonishing, almost—things about these two chapters.

There was the scribe who, in the midst of the disputes raised by others, asked him which commandment is most important of all. When the Lord answered that none are greater than to love God and to love your neighbor, the fellow replied, "You are right, Teacher. You have truly said..." The man was wise, honest, and humble. Jesus commended him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God" (12:32-34).

There was also the widow at the offering box. Many were putting in large sums, maybe with some show. She put in everything she had, but she was poor, and it wasn't much, and there was no attention. But Jesus was watching, and he called his disciples just to commend her. "This poor widow has put in more than all," he said, "everything she had, all she had to live on" (12:42-44).

People like these are not found just everywhere, but they're around. Part of being like the Lord we're following is to spot them, and to give them credit, and to not let life blind us to the goodness in people.
