Motherhood

The Scriptures speak of motherhood with great respect but without romanticizing the role. The view taken is marked by realism. It's understood that motherhood involves more than having borne offspring, and that relationally it has the capacity for both good and ill, and that the ways persons regard it and respond to it are determinant factors in their lives.

A mother is a regular human being on a journey of faith in what someone else can become. Her sorrows are lost in her joy at another's wellbeing. That person is tender and only beloved in her sight, the beneficiary of her attentive care and her tireless work. There is a law on her tongue, training in her hands, comfort at her knee, gentleness in her way, and treasure in her heart that's made of memories. By the nature of it, there's an unselfishness, a kind of humility, a nobility, in real motherhood.

So what could anyone of half-decent character do but honor it? Wisdom demands that one bless his mother, not forsake her teaching, conduct himself in such a way that she can be glad, and not despise her when the years have taken their toll. How foolish and shameful to be a sorrow to one's mother, to chase her away with curses or violence, to steal property or peace from her! Surely children's rising up to call a noble woman blessed is one of the most sacred human obligations.

But honoring goodness requires facing reality, else the honor is empty. And the reality of the human condition is that the calling of motherhood is too often met faithlessly. Without the guidance of godliness, it can be overtaken by selfishness, manipulation, and heartbreak. It can get to the place where like-mother-like-daughter is not a hopeful thought. There can be such a thing as a mother who asks her daughter for someone's head.

God's calling elevates us all. Motherhood comes to be modeled after God's care. It's then approached with his long-term view of things. It's fulfilled in keeping with his will. And it's appreciated and honored among his people more than anywhere.
