Just Thinking

Today we turn the sheet over and move to the other half of the year in our daily Bible reading schedule. These readings we do together are one means we've used to nourish our connection with the Lord and with each other. After all, neither of these relationships "live by bread alone." Thinking our way through the word together is a rewarding experience.

For example, Matthew 9-10 is our reading for this Lord's day. I notice as I read the Lord's involvement with us in all the different kinds of hurts we endure in the world. I see his compassion for harassed and helpless people. I watch him exercising incredible authority to take our illnesses and bear our diseases. I hear him speaking the good news of the kingdom of heaven. And I, like people who are present in these scenes, glorify God for has been done among us.

But there's more. I hear the mercy of heaven expressed to me in so many phrases the Lord speaks. Take heart, your sins are forgiven. Follow me; I came to call people like you. Your faith has made you well. Not dead, but sleeping. Fear not; you are of more value than many sparrows. I will confess you before my Father in heaven. Whoever receives me receives him who sent me. He will by no means lose his reward. These are among the most wonderful statements I've ever heard.

And something else becomes apparent to me as I take in these scenes. It's not all comfortable. The Lord's presence among us frightens and astonishes. He knows hearts. He expects mercy. He wants to know whether I think he's able. It's one who endures to the end who'll be saved, he says. He's maligned, so none who follow him can be too good to experience the same thing. There'll be pressure to deny him before men. Finding life involves loosing it for his sake.

It's as I would've expected if I thought about it. The Lord can't be kind and powerful enough to bring so much hope and encouragement without also being so awesome and good that he requires priority and accountability. There sure is a lot to think about in two chapters like these.
