Good Questions

Good questions that have great answers can make a huge difference, either in one person's life and in the history of us all. But one thing I take from Matthew 22-23, our reading for this Lord's day, is that it depends on whether they arise in noble hearts, and whether they're asked with honorable intentions.

In these scenes, the Lord is met with some questions I'm sure we've all thought about. Where does authority appropriately come from? What is God's way for his people to deal with "Caesar," that is, the state? What will our relationships be like in the resurrection? What are our most important obligations here and now? And, the one that effects all the others, what about the Christ?

All good questions—as important as any that have ever been raised. They were asked of the right person, too, and they were given appropriate answers, under the circumstances. But none of them made much difference in the people who asked, and it was because they hadn't asked in order to know the truth or to do right.

Other things are on their minds. They're seeking to arrest him. They've plotted how to entangle him in his words. They have no intention of learning anything, or of changing their minds, or behaving differently toward him.

What Jesus went ahead to say about them makes me think about what could have been. Suppose the same questions were asked by humble people with reverence for holy things. Imagine if they had come from hearts where justice, mercy, and faithfulness were the weighty things, and where lesser things still mattered. What would have happened then? I wonder.

Wouldn't we have loved the chance to have asked some of these things? But we do in our reading of them! Good questions that have great answers can and will make a huge difference in those who do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with their God.
