Making Good Use of Life

How do you go about living well? What are the first steps anyone could take toward making the best possible use of his or her life? Why do some end up with more successful outcomes than others? This seems like a good time of the year to ask.

And the three stories Jesus tells in Matthew 25 seem like a good place to look for answers. They're told in the decisive hour of his own life, but each addresses a factor that's decisive in every life. Taken together, they set forth three guiding principles for successful living.

First, prepare yourself (v.1-10). All ten girls wanted to go with the bridegroom into the marriage feast, but the wise got themselves ready for it, while the foolish expected someone else to have done it for them. Where's the main place you want to go in your life? Focus on getting your own self ready to go there.

Second, use what you have (v.14-30). Three fellows were entrusted with things to use, each according to his ability. None had the same amount, but each had the same opportunity, and all were accountable to the owner. The good and faithful ones use what they had; the wicked and slothful one buried it. What talent do you have and what door is open to you? Do your best with it.

Third, be good to the people around you (v.31-46). Treat them like you would treat the Lord. If you want to inherit his kingdom, identify with people like the Lord did, and serve like he did. Get in the habit of noticing the ordinary needs in the lives of your neighbors in the normal arenas of your life, and of just doing what you can to help without it seeming like any big deal to you. You'll be blessed.

Jesus told other judgment stories that also matter (those in Matthew 13, for example). But the big points of these three little illustrations are great starting places for making good use of our lives.
