The Value of Knowing What's Written

The chapter that describes the beginning of Jesus' ministry illustrates the high practical value of knowing what is written. It's Luke 4, and it's our Bible reading for this Lord's day. It's quite enlightening to observe how useful his understanding of what Scripture says is to him in these pivotal scenes.

His grasp of what is written enabled him to overcome the tempter's approaches. He knew that we don't live by bread alone (v.4; Deut. 8:3), and that no one is worthy of our worship and service but God (v.8; Deut. 6:13), and that we shouldn't put God to the test (v.12; Deut. 6:16). Knowing what's written gave him valuable guiding principles, even enough so to recognize and to avoid the evil one's misuse of Scripture (v.10, 11).

Understanding what Scripture says also served Jesus well in clearly stating his purpose. He was able to stand up in the assembly in his home town, to find where it was written in Isaiah 61:1-2, and to apply it straightforwardly. He was the one anointed to proclaim good news the poor, sent to proclaim liberty to captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor (v.18-19). He acted in keeping with what he knew the Word said of him, and in order to fulfill it.

Knowing what's written is what allowed Jesus to cope with criticism in a healthy way, too. People around town thought of his as "just Joseph's son" and weren't ready to consider him as anything more, regardless of what their own Writings said. But Jesus knew that only that widow over in hated Sidon had cared for the great prophet Elijah (v.25-26; 1 Kgs. 17:1f), and that only Naaman the Syrian had allowed himself to be cleansed of leprosy in Elisha's day (v.27; 2 Kgs. 5:1f). He understood what was going on.

Quite a bit of what we do in our life as a congregation is directed toward inscribing on our hearts an understanding of what is written. It might serve us well to read Luke 4, to see how valuable a gift that can be in a person's life, and to be reminded how important our time and effort toward that end really are. —Bill McFarland
