Emphasis on People

In the beginning of his ministry, Jesus began with people. That's one thing I take from Luke 5, our reading for this first day of a new week. Observing the Lord's approach makes us grateful for his valuing us. It also instructs us to imitate him by prioritizing persons in our service to God.

Follow the actions of Jesus through the chapter. He gets into one boat and teaches a crowd of people from it. But he then directs his attention to a person, the owner of the boat, and rewards him richly for the use of it. That person, Simon Peter, is astonished at the catch and in awe of the Lord. Jesus, however, turns him toward people. "Do not be afraid," he says, "from now on you will be catching men" (5:10).

After that, a man who's full of leprosy comes and falls down before the Lord. He is unclean, isolated, hopeless. But he's convinced that Jesus, if he will, can make him clean. And, of all people, Jesus focuses on him, touches him, and says to him, "I will; be clean" (5:12, 13). What a difference in that one person's life!

Next we come to a scene that has all kinds of moving parts: Jesus in a house teaching, Pharisees and teachers of the law sitting there, a crowd pressed all around, and fellows on the roof letting a paralyzed friend down through the tiles. Jesus sees the faith of those who're helping their friend, but he gives his attention to that individual who needs what only he can give –forgiveness—and he gives it (5:20). It's an extraordinary thing, done for an ordinary guy.

Then there's a tax collector, Levi (Matthew, as we know him). He's perhaps as much an outcast as the leper above was, only in a different way. But the Lord sees him, speaks to him, and says to him, "Follow me." And this particular man does! He gets up, leaves everything, and follows Jesus (5:27, 28). We're blessed that he did, too.

Finally, a large company of people is at Levi's house for a feast he makes for Jesus. "Tax collectors and sinners!" some grumble at his associating with them. But the Lord sees persons—persons who need who him, people whom he has come to call (5:31, 32). He sees people who can change, people who would rejoice in having him present, and in having the new situation he brings into the world (5:33, 34).

The one who came to do the will of God started with people. He made persons his priority. Surely his church will do so, too.
