Regular People and Surprising Things

It's not the ones you would expect. At least it's not once you've put Jesus in the picture. The people who express surprising faith, receive incredible blessings, raise understandable doubts, and demonstrate grateful love are surprising.

The seventh chapter of Luke shows what I mean. It's not one of the covenant people, but a Roman army officer, a centurion stationed at Capernaum, who expresses the strongest faith in the authority of the Messiah. "I am not worthy to have you come under my roof," he says, "but say the word, and let my servant be healed" (v. 6-7).

It's not well-known and influential citizen of a powerful city who appeals to Almighty God and receives a loved one back from the clutches of death. It's an unnamed widow from a small town, quietly bearing the grief of the loss of her only son. The Lord was moved with compassion at the sight of her, and without her asking, he told her son to arise and gave him back to her (v. 14-15).

Neither is it a vocal skeptic who raises the question of whether Jesus is really the anticipated Christ, or not. It's John, the prophet who had been sent to prepare the way for him. From Herod's prison, he sent messengers to ask the Lord, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" It was an honest and understandable question from a surprising source. What the messengers brought back from the Lord was reassuring affirmative evidence and a blessing (v. 19-20, 22-23).

And it's not the respectable fellow who has invited Jesus to his house for a meal at his table who loves the Lord most. It's a woman of the city, a sinner, who knows Christ has forgiven her of so much. Her humble gratitude was so genuinely loving that it overflowed in bold, selfless, public display of personal devotion to him (v. 44-47).

Are you just a regular person? I am. That doesn't mean we don't have a place in the story of Christ. We're the kind of people in whose lives surprising things have happened before. With the Lord in the picture, we can stand by our confession, find reassurance, be richly blessed, and love deeply, because he first loved us.
