Welcoming

You can see it in the first paragraph of our daily reading for this Lord's day. It's in the interaction between Jesus, Zacchaeus, and the crowd. In a specific situation, Jesus maintained clarity about his <u>mission</u>. He had come to do his Father's will by acting to seek and to save the lost (Lk. 19:10; cf. Jn. 6:38). That was his purpose.

But in the case of Zacchaeus, the Lord also demonstrated a <u>vision</u> for how he might accomplish that purpose. He saw that he could move toward his mission by <u>welcoming</u>. Watch how he does it as you're reading the story.

Jesus welcomed Zacchaeus' interest in him. He saw a person who was seeking to see him, a man who was interested in who Jesus was and what he had come to do. Others may have disregarded him as merely a wealthy little guy of a disreputable class who belonged on the fringe somewhere, but not Jesus. The Lord gave him his attention, called him down from the tree, by name, and attached importance to him (Lk. 19:1-5a).

And we might say that Jesus then welcomed himself into Zacchaeus' house. Basically that's what he did—he invited himself (Lk. 19:5b). But he was honoring a person's interest and tending to his need. It couldn't have happened another way; the crowd and the timing would've prevented his ever being a guest in the home of Zacchaeus if Jesus hadn't himself been welcoming.

Then Jesus was welcomed by Zacchaeus, eagerly and joyfully, to be his guest in his house (Lk. 19:6). It was a welcome that meant something, too, for depending on how we're to take it, it either changed the way he was living or corrected the estimation of him that people had (Lk. 19:8). Either way, Jesus certainly attached a different meaning to this welcome than the grumbling crowd did (Lk. 19:7, 9).

The church shares the mission of its Lord. The mission stays the same; a vision fits the setting. Welcoming was then, and is now, a good first step in a vision of how we, here and now, can help to seek and to save the lost.
