I've noticed that in the instances I can find in the scriptures where responsible servants were given to the church, it was a relief to the church, not further pressure upon it. It was followed by joy, fruitfulness, and peace. I expect it to be that way for us too.

Valuable aspects of our fellowship continued on last week, and we anticipate that they will this week as well. For example, some called several others to check on them. Some helped families who were coping with illness. Some reached across generations in a Ties That Bind friendship. Some got some quiet time and used it to catch up with our daily Bible readings. Some worked on Bible class materials. Some prayed for someone who is bearing a burden. For all these things and many others, we're grateful.
