WHEN RIGHT BECOMES WRONG

(via January 6, 2019 Bulletin)

If you have grown up in an active religious world, chances are that you have heard this expression many times. Mostly it was used when we questioned some plan, statement or philosophy which had rapidly sprung up and had interrupted or even threatened our manner of life. It was and still is in some circles used quite often whether or not it was brought on by some earthshaking event or circumstance. But today, we need to be asking ourselves this question as we see so many rapid changes which are bombarding our faith as well as our consciences. All of a sudden, at least measured by the hundreds of years of proven practices, the world has decided that what used to work - what used to create contentment - what used to bring on happiness and to some degree financial success - no longer is workable if not illegal. Is it possible for something to so alter the mind that people are led into thinking that the RIGHT THING is the WRONG THING and that the WRONG THING is the RIGHT THING? The prophet, Isaiah, spoke of such in the long ago and even pronounced his woes against such thinking: "Woe unto them that call evil good and good evil; that put darkness for light and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter" (Isaiah 5:20).

If there is any comfort which might still be available to us, it is that movements to change the normal have always been launched to alter and even eradicate all our connections with the faith "once delivered to the saints" (Jude 3). In spite of such efforts the promise made by Jesus himself still proves to be true. "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away" (Matt. 24:35). Jesus also promised, "I am with you always, even unto the end of the world" (Matt. 28:20). The wise man of today would still do well to build his house on the Rock of Jesus Christ and Him crucified (Luke 6:48-49).

Having said these things, surely faithful Christians must be disturbed because they have been encroached on the long standing principles and policies which have successfully guided their lives in the past. As disturbing as they are, we must realize that we cannot violate the very standards which have proved themselves to be the best choice for mankind.

It bothers many of us who have seen the very basic principles of godly living being challenged. It also bothers many of us as we hear of "militant" groups who, in the name of Christianity, are actually arming themselves and participating in military type maneuvers in readiness for a "warfare" against the enemies of God. Do people actually believe that God, who brought this world into existence, who demonstrated His mighty power in the destruction of the world in the days of Noah and who struck down the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah, must have "help" in physically destroying those who are against Him? God forbid!
