By Day and At Night

I'm so grateful for your thinking of me through these recent months. I've noticed how often you've encouraged me and strengthened me with verses of Scripture. I'd like to try to return the favor, at least a little.

Here's a series of great sayings from the Psalms I've arranged in a series of sticky notes on my desk. They've become precious to me as the energies of my days and nights have been occupied with making it through.

1. "I lay down and slept; I woke again, for the LORD sustained me...In peace I will both lie down and sleep; for you alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety" (Ps. 3:5; 4:8). The experience of mornings and evenings is evidence of the care and keeping of God.

2. "In the day of my trouble I seek the Lord; in the night my hand is stretched out without wearying; my soul refuses to be comforted" (Ps. 77:2). Life sustained by God includes days of trouble and difficult nights.

3. "This is my comfort in my affliction, that your promise gives me life" (Ps. 119:50). The thought of life as a gift based on promises opens the way to a different future and begins to restore order.

4. "I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the LORD more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning" (Ps. 130:5-6). Hoping is waiting for the one whose promises you're depending upon.

5. "The LORD will fulfill his purpose for me; your steadfast love, O LORD, endures forever. Do not forsake the work of your hands" (Ps. 138:8). Fulfillment of God's promises depends on his unfailing love, not on circumstances.

6. "I will say to the LORD, 'My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust" (Ps. 91:2). Renewal of confidence in the God who has always been caring and keeping is right.

7. "By day the LORD commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life" (Ps. 42:8). The sense of peace we started with is restored, at least for this moment.

8. "Let me hear in the morning of your steadfast love, for in you I trust. Make me know the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul" (Ps. 143:8). We turn to the life that is ahead, purposing to live it for the Lord.

When these sayings are read together as expressions of the process of living for the Lord, they help when help is needed. I hope they'll bless you in that way. --Bill McFarland


